Master Plan Update:

2022 main sewer lines – repair projects:

• Iron Horse has not provided a completion date for the remaining T-liners.

Generator replacement for Treatment Plant:

- OEM SPIRE II Grant application for the new generator was not accepted for funding. OEM stated that
 for this grant, they will be funding those that score at or above 75% and the Sanitary District fell below
 that threshold.
- Andrew Tagliafico spoke with the Fire Marshall about the District's need to add a bulk fuel tank, for the new Generator. The District will need to report an annual audit each year, through the State Fire Marshall.
- Puttman Infrastructure will research above the ground tank options.

Mt. Hood Brewing – waste water treatment proposal, dated 10/10/2022:

Curt McLeod P.E./Curran-McLeod, Inc. – Email response dated 11/11/22

- The brewery has submitted a reference to 250 mg/L BOD allowable in their waste, but I would expect that could be higher in the sewer use ordinance. The SDC methodology identifies flow, BOD (which is assumed to be interpreted as the same as CBOD) and TSS, but no concentrations. Based on the math, the 700 CF per month and .25 pound of BOD listed in the resolution equates to 174 mg/L, and 0.20 pounds of TSS equates to 140 mg/L. Based on the brewery flow rate, they would be 4.15 EDU. Based on BOD at 250 mg/L they would be 6 EDU. Without TSS data, we cannot calculate the EDU based on TSS but would expect it to be slightly higher than the EDU based on BOD. I expect the highest of the three EDU calculations is the one that applies.
- Andrew Tagliafico stated that the Brewery would most likely be billed six (6) SDCs, based on the BOD.
- After actual BOD and TSS is determined, the Brewery could be billed additional SDC fees at the same rate as the initial six (6) SDCs.
- If the actual BOD and TSS is calculated less than six (6) SDCs, the District could refund the difference.

Gov't Camp Incorporation study:

• Brett Fischer mentioned that the District can hold off on sending a letter stating the study would benefit the community.

SDIS matching security grant:

• No update.

PGE claim for extended power outage:

- PGE shut off power to Government Camp due to wild fire danger, between 9/9/22 9/11/22.
- GCSD filed a claim for the \$6,091.50 Operator expense to maintain the plant generator.
- PGE notified the District on October 20, 2022, that the claim was denied, stating "PGE has a tariff approved by the Oregon Public Utility Commission that specifically states that they are not liable to customers for any loss or damage that result from interruptions in electricity service".
